## **Conditional Structures**

We use conditional structures to talk about results of a condition. Usually we use 'if' to show that something may happen as a result of the condition.

We can change the tense of the verbs in the sentences to change how likely we think something is to happen. For more information see my longer lesson document on conditionals. For an overview of the main types of conditional sentences see the table below. **Note** v1 = present verb and v2 = past verb.

Туре	Form	Use	Example
0	lf + v1 + v1	Facts/ habits	If the lesson <b>is</b> interesting, I <b>learn</b> a lot.
1	lf + v1 + will	Future	If I <b>study</b> hard, I <b>will</b> <b>pass</b> the test.
2	lf + v2 + would	Unreal future	If I <b>spoke</b> French, I <b>would work</b> in Paris.
3	If + past perfect + present perfect	Past that can't change	If I <b>had learnt</b> French, I <b>would have taken</b> the job in Paris.
